

MOMOS

Momos are a ubiquitous delicacy in Nepal, deeply woven into the country's culinary fabric despite their Tibetan origins. These delicious dumplings come in various shapes and sizes, with the most common being leaf-shaped or round. Typically filled with meat or vegetables, momos are prepared in several ways: steamed, fried, or “kothey”—a delightful combination of half-steamed and half-fried. They are usually served with a spicy, tangy tomato-based chutney, though the accompaniments can vary depending on the eatery. Modern twists on the classic momo have introduced adventurous fillings like cheese or mashed potato, making them a versatile and beloved treat across Nepal.



Chatamari

Sekuwa is a mouthwatering treat that rivals, and for many surpasses, the appeal of kebabs. A traditional delicacy of Nepal's Limbu community, this smoky delight has become a favorite on the streets of the Himalayan nation. Sekuwa can be made from any meat—pork, lamb, goat, chicken, or even a mix—marinated in a blend of traditional herbs and spices. The meat is then grilled over an open wood fire, infusing it with a smoky aroma that fills the air, drawing in eager crowds. Despite its popularity, sekuwa isn't readily available everywhere in Nepal, so a bit of research is often needed to locate the best spots to savor this flavorful dish.

THUKPA

Originally a Tibetan comfort food, thukpa has embraced a distinct Nepali twist as it crossed borders into the Himalayan nation. Treasured as a hearty and satisfying meal, thukpa features a rich, flavorful broth filled with hand-pulled boiled noodles, vegetables, and meat—commonly buffalo, though other options are widely available. What gives it a unique Nepali flair are the spices, particularly garam masala and chili, which add a warm, spicy kick. Vegetarian versions are also widely served, making this cozy, wholesome dish accessible to veg-lovers as well. Perfectly suited for chilly days, thukpa is a bowl of warmth and comfort that feels like home.




Buddha Stupa



DAL BHAT

The pickles, often made from ingredients like mango, tomato, or chili, bring a spicy and tangy element that perfectly complements the mildness of the dal and rice.



Sel Roti

Sel Roti is a traditional Nepali delicacy, often prepared during festivals and special occasions. This sweet, ring-shaped rice doughnut is made from rice flour, sugar, yogurt, and a hint of cardamom, giving it a unique texture and flavor. The dough is deep-fried to golden perfection, creating a crisp outer layer while maintaining a soft, chewy interior. Typically enjoyed with tea or as a part of festive meals, Sel Roti is especially popular during major celebrations like Dashain and Tihar. Its sweet and savory taste, along with its festive significance, makes it a beloved treat in Nepalese households, symbolizing joy and community during holidays.

GUNDRUK

Gundruk is a traditional Nepali dish made from fermented leafy green vegetables, typically mustard greens, spinach, or radish leaves. The leaves are fermented naturally by drying them in the sun, which enhances their flavor and creates a tangy, sour taste. Annapurna Base Camp Trek

BEST ACTIVITY TO DO IN POKHARA



The Annapurna Base Camp (ABC) Trek is one of Nepal's most popular and rewarding trekking routes, offering stunning views of the Annapurna mountain range and a chance to experience the diverse landscapes and cultures of the region. The trek takes you through lush rhododendron forests, traditional Gurung villages, and high-altitude terrain, eventually leading to the base camp at an altitude of 4,130 meters (13,550 feet). Along the way, trekkers are treated to spectacular panoramas of Annapurna South, Machapuchare (Fishtail), Hiunchuli, and other towering peaks. The trek typically takes around 7-12 days to complete, depending on the route and pace, and is considered moderate in difficulty, making it accessible to both experienced trekkers and those new to high-altitude trekking.
